Bonnie Wright collaborated with Too Good to Go to lead the initiative to reduce food waste.[18] The purpose and use Too Good To Go is to reduce food waste worldwide. Supports a free mobile application that connects restaurants and shops that have not sold, surplus food.[2][10] with customers who can then buy any food that the outlet considers to be surplus to the requirements without being able to choose at a much lower price than normal. The food products in the app are at the price of one third of the original price.[19][20] The company claims that this reduces food waste that would otherwise have been discarded; Food waste is a global environmental problem. In three years, the app has reached more than 9.5 million users. More than seventeen,000 factories and 10092382 food packaging have been associated[when?]. An Android or iOS mobile phone is required and must be delivered to the seller. The potential customer runs the TGTG app, which shows which outlets have the type of food (food in the oven, products, vegan food) available within a given radius and in a given time batch, usually thirty minutes or more. The application can do too much work on its main wire." So what it really means, because it should be worried and how to solve it. This means that your code is requiring a lot of time to process and frames are jumped because of it, Maybe because of a heavy processing that you are doing at the heart of your application or DB access or anything else that causes the wire to stop for a while. Here is a more detailed explanation: Choreographer allows apps to connect to vsync, and correctly time things to improve performance. Android visualization animations use Choreographer internally for the same purpose: for the correct time animations and possibly improve performance. Since the choreographer is told of each vsync event, I can tell if one of the Runnables went along from the choreographer. post* apis does not end in the time of a frame, causing the removal of frames. In my understanding Choreographer can only detect the frame skipping. He has no way of saying why that happens.
